


Sara's Spring Chicken™ Pastured Poultry Protocols

Sara's Spring Chicken™ Kosher Pastured Poultry (chicken, turkey, duck) is produced exclusively for Grow and Behold Foods. Naftali Hanau of Grow and Behold Foods LLC is the sole purchasing agent for Sara's Spring Chicken. All producers of Sara's Spring Chicken are subject to random inspection to ensure compliance with the following protocols.

- Sara's Spring Chicken is never given any antibiotics, medications, or growth enhancing hormones during production.
- Chicks/poults/ducklings are brooded indoors until they reach approximately 2-3 weeks of age, when they are then moved outside. Birds may be pastured in "chicken tractors" (movable greenhouse-like pens with open bottoms) or on open, managed pastures with protected housing at night.
- Heat lamps are provided in the chicken tractors during the first few weeks when the birds are outdoors if necessary.
- Foraging behavior may be encouraged by several methods: moving tractors to fresh pasture daily; moving tractors 2x daily during final weeks of growth; delaying feeding until a few hours after moving the chickens.
- Tractors are moved to fresh pastureland every day to encourage foraging behavior. The pasture is a mix of short grasses and legumes.
- Birds are provided with feed and water daily to supplement pasture grazing.
- During inclement weather chickens are generally kept outdoors, and tarp coverage is extended as necessary to provide increased protection. During extreme weather, birds are moved indoors and returned to pasture as quickly as possible.
- During the winter, poultry are grown indoors and outdoors in moveable greenhouses with access to pasture provided by snow-clearing and through greenhouse floors. Birds are fed outdoors to encourage grazing and pasture is supplemented with cabbage, lettuce and other fresh green matter.
